
Our Vision

Office Hours

The Link2Learn Virtual Charter School office is open daily, according to the 2023-2024 School Calendar, which can be found on our web page. Office hours are 8am - 3:30pm during the school year, unless otherwise communicated by Link2Learn staff.

Summer hours are ongoing but irregular. Our contact email account will be monitored for emails and phone calls on a daily basis and emails will be answered within the required 24 hour time frame. **On Fridays, all district offices are usually closed.**

School Closing

Link2Learn office staff, and any events held on-site, will follow the direction of the Chetek-Weyerhaeuser Area School District. School closings, delays, and early dismissals are listed on the CWASD website:

Students taking **Course Options** courses will need to follow the direction of each educational institution you are enrolled with in regards to school closings. It is your responsibility to be informed of closings and to report the correct attendance information to Link2Learn.

Ordering Materials

Link2Learn will provide all students with all materials required for course completion based on the courses listed in the student's Individualized Learning Plan (ILP). This includes online course access and curriculum. In addition, Link2Learn will purchase supplemental materials for students that directly support the learning happening in their courses.

Ordering Supplemental Materials

A student or parent must submit a **Material Request Form** when requesting that Link2Learn purchase supplemental materials. Supplemental materials must be approved for purchase by your student's academic guide. Upon submitting your Material Request Form you will be notified if any items have not been approved for purchase. Items requested must support the coursework the student is engaged in and that must be communicated on the Material Request Form.

No Sell Provision

Link2Learn does not require families to return the majority of items purchased for student use. There are some items that Link2Learn does require to be returned, you will be notified of those items upon request and an agreement to return will be signed. Parents/Guardians and/or students may not sell any supplies acquired through Link2Learn for personal profit to a third party. The district will use legal means to recover the original value of materials, equipment or supplies should they be sold.

Only orders submitted using the Link2Learn Materials Request Form will be processed.


- Ordering supplies and curriculum will be conducted only by Link2Learn staff. Under NO circumstances will reimbursements be sent to parents.
- Orders will be delivered to your home address or you may pick up your materials from the Link2Learn office in Chetek, WI.
- Packing slips and invoices MUST be shared with Link2Learn staff via email, including information about missing items.
- Parents assume all responsibility for costs associated with returning or exchanging materials.
 - All orders must be submitted to Link2Learn by the deadline listed below for each semester.

Fall Semester: December 1 Spring Semester: April 1

The following items WILL NOT be purchased by Link2Learn:

- Tutoring from outside contractors without a demonstrated need and prior approval
- Homeschooling co-op fees or expenses
- Payment for passes or memberships
- Memberships to clubs outside of the Chetek-Weyerhaeuser Area School District
- Religious materials
- Toys and games
- Technology other than equipment provided through Link2Learn
- Furniture
- Musical instruments, books, and accessories
- Sports camps or clinics, league fees or associated costs
- Sports or other league fees or associated costs
- College admissions application fees and college prep test fees including AP Exams

All of the decisions we make for students are guided by this three part diagram. Link2Learn will always choose to ensure the Core Curriculum is purchased for every student before allowing supplemental materials to be purchased.



Technology

Google Apps for Education

Link2Learn will assign each student/family their own email account through Google. Sign-in information will be sent to students/families and a brief training of how to use the various Google Apps will be provided by Link2Learn staff.

Devices

Link2Learn will provide one device for each student upon enrollment for the purpose of completing his/her coursework if the device is requested by the student's parent/guardian. If the student leaves the program within the first school year of enrollment, the device will either be returned to Link2Learn at the parent/guardian's expense, or the parent/guardian can choose to pay the purchase price to Link2Learn and keep the device. After completing one full calendar year with Link2Learn the device will not need to be returned.

Link2Learn will purchase one device per student every three years, if needed.

Link2Learn will not pay for repairs or replacement of the device. The parent/guardian is responsible for arranging and funding all repairs and/or replacement of the device.

A device in need of repair is not an acceptable reason for a student to fall behind in completing his/her course work. Should a device be in need of repair, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to find another way for the student to complete his/her course work.
