

Chetek-Weyerhaeuser Area School District, in partnership with the Barron County Sheriff's Department, is excited to announce the addition of a full-time school resources officer, Deputy Erik Sedani.

Sedani started in the new role on Tuesday this week and will serve at both Roselawn Elementary and CWHS/MS. He is a five-year veteran of the Sheriff's Department and notes he is excited for the position. While his main role at the school district will be safety, he will also work towards building relationships with the students and staff and serve as a resource both in and out of the classroom. Deputy Sedani will be available at the school district every day from 7:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. He will also take part in after-school activities, groups/ clubs and other events, including athletics. During the non-school months, Sedani will move into the sheriff department's patrol division but will continue to take part in the Chetek community as needed.

"We are excited for this partnership with the Chetek-Weyerhaeus-



Superintendent Mark Johnson notes he, too, is looking forward to seeing this position get going.

"Deputy Sedani will be a great addition to the staff and will be in the parking lots, lunchrooms, classrooms and be part of our school and community," says Johnson. 



"We did some research on pricing, talked to a school who already had one in place, talked to Mr. Kowalski, and then made the proposal to Dr. Johnson, who helped us make it happen."

In its inaugural year each student at Roselawn Elementary School will receive a book as a present for their birthday. Each week, Mr. Kowalski will announce the birthdays for that week, along with the half-birthdays, so those who have a birthday in July will be announced during the month of January and so on. Once the announcements are over, students will be released from their classroom to come down to the vending machine where Huiras will meet them and give them their special gold token/coin to put in the machine and select their book. For those students who have already had their birthdays this school year, Huiras plans to make special arrangements with their classroom teachers to schedule a time for them to receive their book before the end of the school year.



The hope is that students will also have the opportunity to earn books through the PBIS rewards system during the school year.

The vending machine was unveiled recently with the help of some Roselawn students and was immediately put to use! As it was unveiled, students in the art classroom across the hall could be heard exclaiming with sheer excitement "It's a book vending machine!! If initial reaction is any indication, the new machine will be enjoyed by students for years to come.

4K Screening For Newest Bulldogs Set



CWASD will be registering 4-year-old kindergarten students for the 2023-24 school year one day only, Friday, March 31, at Roselawn Elementary School.

This program (Bright Beginners) is open to all children who will be four years old on or before September 1, 2023. Kindergarten (K5) screening will be conducted on that date as well, for children who have not attended a K4 program.

The registration and screening will require approximately one hour for parent and child. The screening includes vision, communication, and social development. Parents will meet with Scott Kowalski, Elementary School Principal, and Chelsi Jenness, Guidance Counselor, to register their child and learn about the Bright Beginnings 4-year-old kindergarten program, busing, and breakfast and lunch program. Parents will also be able to talk with teachers about their child's development.




Annual Variety Show Brings Scholarships to Students
